John 15: 5-6

ABIDE IN ME, AND I IN YOU

(5th Sunday of Easter – Acts 9: 26-31, 1 John 3: 18-24, John 15: 1-8)

The Scripture Readings on this Fifth Sunday of Easter emphasize the need for Christians to abide in Christ as a condition for producing the Spirit's fruits of kindness, mercy, charity, and holiness.

The first reading, taken from the Acts of the Apostles, testifies to the abundance of spiritual fruits yielded by the apostles because of their close bond with the Risen Lord. The reading tells us how the Lord pruned the former fanatical Pharisee, Saul of Tarsus, who had persecuted the Church, to produce a fruit-bearing branch called Paul, the zealous Apostle to the Gentiles, a man now entirely dedicated to the proclamation of the Gospel. In today's second reading, John, in his first letter to the Church, explains that only if we remain united with Christ by putting our Faith in Him and drawing our spiritual strength from Him, will we be able to obey God's commandments, especially the commandment of love. In the Gospel, taken from the Last Supper discourse, Jesus uses God's Old Testament image of the vine and branches to help His disciples to understand the closeness of their relationship with Him and the necessity of their maintaining it. They are not simply Rabbi and disciples. Their lives are mutually dependent – as close as a vine and its branches. In fact, in using this image, Jesus is explaining to them and to us what our relationship with Him should become. And Jesus teaches us how to become true disciples of His and how to abide in Him as branches abide in the main trunk of the vine and how to draw their life from the vine.

Let us abide in Christ and let Christ abide in us.

WHAT IS A DEACON?

The word 'deacon' comes from the Greek word 'diakonia', which means 'service'. The work of the deacon is an act of service to the community. Deacons can read the Gospel, preach the homily, baptise and perform other ceremonies where there is no Mass. There are two types of deacons who minister in the Church. The first is someone who is training to be a priest and this is the last step before finally being ordained a priest. The second is called a Permanent Deacon and he is not going to be ordained a priest. We know that priests cannot get married, but a married man can be ordained a Permanent Deacon.

SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION



Bishop Kevin will confer the Sacrament of Confirmation on 40 young people of our Parish on Friday, 3rd May at 4 pm in the Church of the Sacred Heart, Riverstown. Please pray for them and their families at this special time.

What happens in Confirmation?

In Confirmation we are imprinted with a permanent seal that can be received only once and marks us forever as a Christian. The gift of the Holy Spirit is the strength from above in which we put the grace of our baptism into practice through our life to act as a 'witness' for Christ.

To be confirmed means to make a 'covenant' with God. You say, 'Yes, I believe in you, my God; give me your Holy Spirit, so that I might belong entirely to you and never be separated from you.'

And God says, 'Yes, I believe in you, too, my child and I will give you my Spirit, my very self. I will belong entirely to you. I will never separate myself from you. I will be in your body and your soul, in your words and deeds. Even if you forget me, I will still be there - on good days and bad.' ('Youcat' 205)


