JESUS MEETS HIS DISCIPLES AFTER HIS RESURRECTION

(3rd Sunday of Easter - Luke 24:35-48)

The Gospel Reading on this Third Sunday of Easter describes Jesus' appearance on the evening of His Resurrection to His apostles who were in the locked Upper Room, the Cenacle. We see Jesus removing the doubts of His apostles about His Resurrection by inviting them to touch Him and by eating a piece of cooked fish. Jesus explains how the prophecies have been fulfilled in Him. Then He commissions them to bear witness to Him and to preach "repentance and forgiveness of sins in His name" after receiving the Holy Spirit.

Life Messages: 1) We need to share the apostles' "Upper Room Experience" in the Holy Mass: The same Jesus who, in the Upper Room, prepared His disciples for their preaching and witnessing mission, is present with us in the Eucharistic celebration. 2) Jesus needs us as witnesses to continue His mission. Jesus needs Spirit-filled followers to be His eyes, ears, hands, and feet, to bear witness to His love, mercy and forgiveness by our interactions with our brothers and sisters. 3) Our daily lives are meant to serve as a means for us to experience and share the Risen Lord with others. Just as the disciples experienced the Risen Lord in their community, let us learn to recognize the presence of Jesus in our own homes, social service centres, nursing facilities, hospitals, workplaces, and schools.

Jesus wants us to be a community which shares and cares, a community which knows how to recognize Jesus in the poor, the marginalized, the sick – that is, in everyone.

This means that, along with his role in Elphin, Bishop Kevin will be carrying out the responsibilities of a bishop in Achonry and exploring, both in Elphin and in Achonry, how we might work towards a closer union between the two Dioceses. We wish Bishop Paul Dempsey every blessing as he moves from the Diocese of Achonry to the Archdiocese of Dublin as Auxiliary Bishop.

The Gospel

After the Second Reading, the Minister of the Word will invite us to stand and greet or welcome the Gospel. Before the Gospel is read, we sing or say the Gospel Acclamation. For most of the Church year we greet the Gospel with the word 'Alleluia', a joyful song of praise. The Alleluia is followed by a verse of Scripture from the Bible. This verse reminds us of the Mass and Readings. During the season of Lent, we do not use the word 'Alleluia'. The Gospel stories tell us about Jesus and we hear what He said to His friends and those who came to listen to Him. So, the reading of the Gospel is different to other readings. It is the most important part of the Liturgy of the Word.


